THE ANNUAL FAMILY CAMPAIGN

Scouting families are asked to voluntarily contribute toward the cost of providing Scouting to one or more Scouts in their community. All the registration fees collected from new and returning members are submitted to our National Council. This campaign is especially important since the United Ways of Snohomish and Whatcom Counties still refuse to allocate funds to us because of our high standards for adult leadership.

How do Packs, Troops, Crews and Ships participate?

District Family FOS Chairs contact unit leaders to schedule unit FOS presentations to explain how Scouting is financed and how local support is needed. These short presentations are usually made in a group meeting setting, either by leaders in the unit or by district volunteers. LDS Stakes conduct their own Family Campaigns and use a Stake FOS Kickoff and a Stake Report meeting. This campaign is supported by a Stake FOS Chair. The Family Campaign is normally conducted in January, February and March.

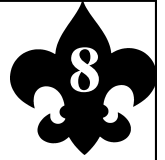

FOS TURN IN SIGNED FOS PLEDGE CARDS ASAP! FOS

Each year about 7% of the money pledged to the FOS campaign is not available to us. The number one reason for this is that FOS volunteers and unit leaders unfortunately wait for the last couple of families to get their pledge cards in before turning in the packet.

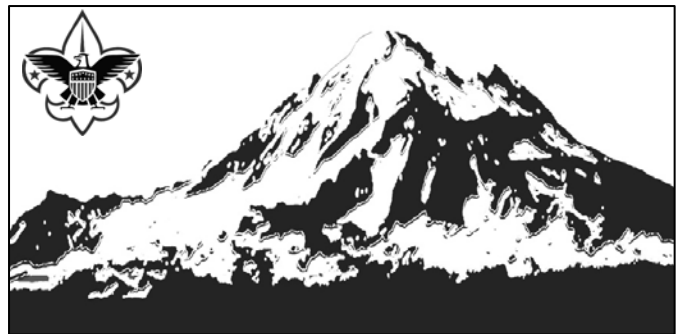
Often this wait turns into months and the donors who could afford to send in \$12-25 a month, do not get a pledge statement reminder until many months after their pledge was made. When the pledges are finally received and processed, time has passed and many dollars are lost. Last year we had two units that waited until November to bring in their packets of pledge cards and checks. In 2011 nearly \$21,000 was lost due to just this situation.

So, please turn in all the completed pledge cards you have as soon as you can. If needed, call the Scout office and we can arrange for someone to come pick them up from you.

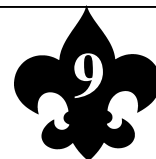

Multiply Your Gift to Scouting in 2012!

Matching Hours and Matching Gift Programs benefit Scouting

Scouting families are able to multiply their FOS contributions to Scouting through the following means. In the council, corporate employees who serve in Scouting raised many thousands of additional dollars on top of those dollars donated directly by our members.

Matching Gift Programs

As part of the unit FOS presentation it should be made clear to parents that many area companies have matching gift programs. A partial list of the companies is found on the back of the current FOS brochure. Employees need to check their company websites or check with the Human Resource or Personnel office for a matching gift form or if it's on the company website. Please complete your submission on the company website or fill out the form and get it to the Scout Service Center. We will process it from there.

Volunteer Service Matching Programs and Camp Vouchers

Many companies have established giving programs that award grants to organizations for which their employees volunteer. **Microsoft, BP and Google** are just two of many great local examples. Encourage your parents to see if their company has such a program and if so, to request matching dollars on the company website to benefit the Mount Baker Council. The Scout Office cannot initiate that request. Because of the reliability of payment, a screen shot of a confirmed grant counts as an FOS pledge for your unit!

Camp Vouchers to recognize volunteer matching hours: These vouchers are available to Packs, Troops, Crews and Ships whose members log their service hours! Reduce your camp fee costs by getting credit for those Scouting volunteer service hours.

NOTE: **Boeing** matching dollars are credited to the council's Endowment and Capital campaigns, rather than to FOS. Boeing employees may direct funds to a James E. West fellowship.

NOTE: The Matching Gift and Matching Hours programs have provided many thousands of additional FOS dollars for the past few years. Those matching dollars "follow the donor" and when the check is received, it will be credited to your unit's FOS totals.

United Way Giving

If your families do donate through the United Way, let them know that they can designate their gift (minus an administrative fee of 15-20%) to an organization of their choosing. We encourage those donors to designate their gift to the Mount Baker Council, BSA.

NOTE: The United Ways of Snohomish and Whatcom Counties no longer allocate dollars toward Scouting, because of our high standards for adult leadership. Please note that the United Ways of Skagit and Island County still support Scouting with modest allocations.

Boeing Employees Community Fund

These designations make a big difference to Scouting. Boeing employees can make changes to their designation plan anytime. Note that Boeing does not match employee giving but helps Scouting in other ways. Please use ECF# A-S0495 to direct funds to Mount Baker Council, rather than to another Scout Council, like Seattle.

What counts for FOS credit?

Please understand that matching gifts are just that: They match the dollars that families or individuals donate. These dollars are not counted as payments of your pledge but are, when received, counted as FOS donations and are credited to your unit.

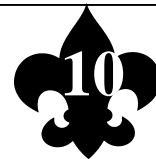
Designated payroll dollars may still be credited toward your unit's Friends of Scouting Recognition (Bronze, Silver, Gold and Presidential) but legally (by non-profit IRS accounting rules) are not booked as FOS donations from individual donors. Members should report these designated payroll gifts on their FOS pledge card.

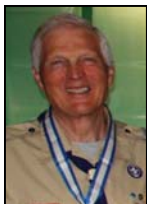
Fire Mountain is centrally located in our council and features 670 acres with our very own Lake Challenge. We have generously stocked this lake each year so that year-

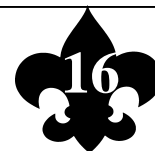

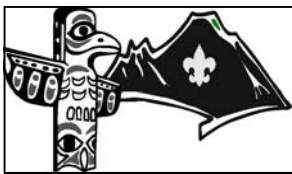

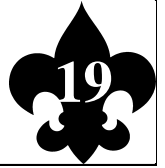
