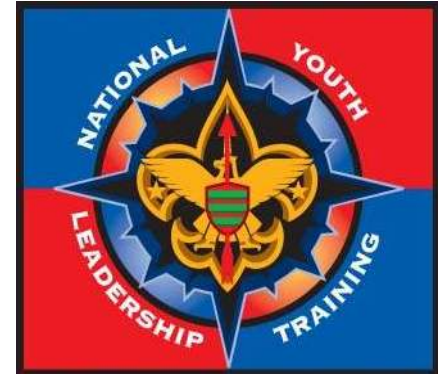

What is the entire reservation, acceptance, and payment process?

- Completed reservations with a \$100 deposit per Scout should be sent to the **Everett Service Center, 1715 100th PL S.E., Everett, WA 98208, (425) 338-0380. Pay in full to get early discount.**
- Reservations are accepted in the order received. Due to the popularity of the course, we do not hold Unit reservations.
- A Unit may send as many Scouts as desired as long as each meets the qualifications. There is NO per Unit quota.
- Scouts will receive confirmation and additional course information shortly after the application is received.
- Deposits are refundable up to 60 days prior to course. Within 60 days of course, the Unit may send an alternate Scout. A refund is not an option except for a true family emergency such as serious illness.
- The Scout's properly dated medical form and fee balance need to be at the Everett service center 30 days before course.
- Should the courses not be full by some rare chance, we will continue to accept applications until 2 weeks prior to course. However, the application should be accompanied by full payment and a current medical form after the 30 day deadline.
- Opportunity Fund need based scholarships, typically half fee, are available. Pay the \$100 deposit and submit your application at the same time. You'll be responsible for any remaining balance.

What is National Youth Leadership Training?

It is a six day experience conducted by Mount Baker Council to provide each Scout with a meaningful Scouting experience that will enhance their knowledge and create a deeper understanding of their role and responsibilities as a leader.

NYLT integrates the best of modern leadership theory with the traditional strengths of the Scouting experience. Through activities, presentations, challenges, discussions, and audio-visual support, NYLT participants engage in a unified approach to leadership that gives the skill and confidence to lead well.

What are the course objectives?

- Give participants the confidence and knowledge to conduct the Boy Scout Troop, Varsity Scout Team., or Venturing Crew program
- Provide participants with a clear understanding of team and personal development and how those elements relate to being a leader
- Guide the participants through the stages of team development
- Create an environment of Scouting fellowship and fun guided by the Scout Oath and Law
- Give participants the opportunity to share ideas and experiences with Scouts from other Troops, Teams, and Crews
- Have fun and experience Scouting at its best.



What is the course content?

Youth at NYLT are learning and using the same skill set and language as what adults learn and use at Wood Badge.

Through activities, events, games, and adventures, NYLT participants will work and play together as they put into action the best Scouting has to offer. They practice and experience leadership skills first hand.

Each Scout returns to their Unit with a toolbox of leadership skills that enables them to better understand their role as someone who can shape the directions of their unit. The Scoutmaster, Team Coach, or Venturing Adult Advisor is the enabler who creates a positive environment for youth leadership.

What are Participant Requirements?

Boy Scout and Varsity Scouts:

- 13 years of age by course
- First Class, Star, Life, or Eagle rank
- Senior Patrol Leader, Team Captain, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, Team Co-Captain, or destined to be
- Scoutmaster or Team Coach recommendation

Venturing Crew Members:

- 14 – 20 years of age by course
- Advisor's recommendation course

NYLT is co-ed and open to both male and female Crew Members—June course only



When and Where?

There are two separate courses offered as separate weeks. Sign-up is first come, first served for the limited spaces.

Course 1 - June 24 – June 29, 2012

Course 2 - August 13 – August 18, 2012

June start at 9:00 AM on a Sunday and August starts at 9:00 AM on a Monday. The conferences conclude after the closing ceremony at 5:30 PM on a Friday for June and 5:30 PM on a Saturday for August

Both conferences will be at Camp Black Mountain, Maple Falls, WA.

What is the cost?

The cost of the conference includes food, training materials, and use of patrol camping equipment. It varies by date of sign-up:

If Attending Course 1

Application, Medical form, and Payment in full by 3/24/12 - \$180, between 3/25 and 5/24/12 - \$215, after 5/25 thru 6/24/12 - \$250

If Attending Course 2

Application, Medical form, and Payment in full by 5/13/12 - \$180, between 5/14 and 7/13/11 - \$215, after 7/14 thru 8/13/11 - \$250
