We are proud to report that 2023 was another successful year for Mount Baker Council, thanks to you, our dedicated volunteers and stakeholders. With non-profits experiencing continued challenges around us, the volunteers and staff of our council exceeded expectations in all areas of operations in order to deliver fun and safe programs for the youth and families we proudly serve.

Our camps were busy delivering year-round outdoor adventures. Our fundraising campaigns for youth programs were highly successful and ensured that we had the resources to balance our budget. And most importantly, we grew our total membership once again to 2,902 youth including a 8.62% growth in Cub Scouts!

We remain committed to delivering life-changing programs for our Scouts while remaining adaptive and innovative as we have more work to do to continue to grow local Scouting.

INVESTING IN SCOUTING

In 2023, our donors strongly supported youth programs generously, including the following key highlights:

UNIT POPCORN SALES



Over \$953k in gross sales generating \$667k for local Scouting programs. #1 Class 400 Council for Trails End Popcorn Sales –2nd year in a row.

Another great event that raised over \$267k in program funds including \$123k in the Raise the Paddle for Scouting program expenses and scholarships for 2023-2024.


MAJOR SUPPORTERS

ABUNDANT ADVANCEMENT



- The Mount Baker Council had 100 Scouts reach the rank of Eagle Scout in 2023.
- Over 17,000 hours in community service hours were generated by all of the Eagle projects.
- The Mount Baker Council held its annual Eagle Scout Recognition Dinner in May with over 150 in attendance with special guest, Lisa Janicki, County Commissioner.

FMSC CAPITAL CAMPAIGN LAUNCH



A new \$1.55 million capital campaign was launched in the summer of 2023. The campaign will invest over \$200k in new roofs, over \$325k in dining hall/kitchen upgrades, \$750k in a brand new Fire Watch tower-an iconic new feature, and over \$225k in a new Program Shelter and courtyard features. A lead gift of \$1,000,000 was secured from the Nysether Family Foundation for the campaign.

Legendary Camp Programs



- The Mount Baker Council seeks to operate a "Legendary" Scout Camp program at Fire Mountain. A scoring system (10 is highest score), derived from the weekly camp evaluation forms for Scouts and Leaders, is our measure. 9.5 total score is "legendary."
- In 2023, our total score was 9.07 among our campers which qualifies as Excellent and improving on the 8.46 (Great) score in 2022.

FUN YOUTH ACTIVITIES By the Numbers

Outing is a major part of Scouting and the Mount Baker Council continued its legacy of fun and adventure programs for our Scouts in 2023 including:

- 1.284 Scouts and 484 volunteers participated in our Summer Camp programs for our Cub Scout and Scouts BSA programs.
- The Cub Scout Adventure Day. at FMSC in October, was attended by 919 Cub Scouts and family members, most of them new to Scouting.
- The Council Webelos-ree, at FMSC in October, provided 648 Webelos and volunteers from our Packs with challenging and exciting programs during the weekend.
- The 3rd annual **Haunted Camp** at FMSC was once again a highlight of spooky fun and games. 546 Scouts, parents, and volunteers enjoyed the thrilling weekend.
- Spring events were well-attended and enjoyed by 732 Scouts, parents and volunteers include the new Dragon Egg Hunt.

FISCAL STEWARDSHIP

The Mount Baker Council showed itself as a strong financial steward of its funds by achieving a balanced budget for the 15th vear in a row.
